Poor Hygiene	Participants	Cross contamination Infection	<p>Participants must not have any open cuts, sores or any other apparent skin disease on their face.</p> <p>Use clean utensils, wash containers, brushes & sponges thoroughly after each session. Try to keep them clean during the session.</p> <p>Change brush water regular and ONLY use a new sponge per participant.</p>	LOW	YES
Reactions	Participants	Skin Allergy	<p>Participants must not have any allergies or allergic reactions to soap, skin creams etc.</p> <p>It is not advisable if they are under 3yrs of age as their immune system is not developed.</p> <p>Always use professional paints and products as recommended by the association and in accordance with EU /FDA regulations.</p> <p>Do not add disinfectant to the water as the paints already contain agents which act against yeast, mould and bacteria.</p>	LOW	YES
Unsupervised Children	Participants	Contact with children	<p>All children are to be with a supervising adult.</p> <p>Physical contact with the child is minimised with the parent lifting the child into the chair and being present throughout.</p>	LOW	YES

Gazebo's	Participants	Gazebo falling Down	<p>Do not use a gazebo in strong winds.</p> <p>That the gazebo is secured in the ground and guy ropes attached or sand bags on each leg to secure.</p> <p>Attach flags or paint guy ropes for public to be able to see and avoid.</p>	Low	YES
